Abstract

Poetry as a form of literary work has great potential to be used as a tool for teaching moral and ethical values, but in-depth research on the role of poetry in education is still lacking. Notably, poetry is often overlooked in formal education curricula despite its ability to touch emotions and evoke deep reflection. This research aims to explore and analyse the educational values contained in the poem "Bukit Semut" by Seno Joko Suyono. Through this critical analysis of poetry, this research seeks to identify various moral and ethical values that can be taught through literature. The main source of data in this study is the text of the poem "Bukit Semut" and various supporting literature that discusses the role of literature in education. This analysis includes aspects of symbolism, narrative, and themes raised in poetry, as well as the relevance of these values in the context of formal education. The results of the study show that the poem "Bukit Semut" teaches values such as respect for nature, search for meaning in life, perseverance, cleanliness, karma, spiritual awareness, sincerity in worship, and courage. These findings suggest that poetry can be an effective teaching tool in moral and ethical education, enriching the literature on literary education and providing a basis for practical implementation in the educational environment. The implication of this research is the importance of integrating poetry in the educational curriculum to help students develop a deeper understanding of various aspects of life and morality. In addition, this research fills a gap in the literature by providing empirical evidence on the impact of poetry in education, which can serve as a basis for further research and the development of more inclusive and holistic curricula. The study also highlights the importance of emotional literacy in education, which is often overlooked in traditional educational approaches, with literature as an effective medium to achieve these goals.

Introduction

In the context of education, poetry has great potential as an effective teaching tool. One of the poems that is rich in educational values is "Bukit Semut" by Seno Joko Suyono. The poem uses deep symbolism and evocative narratives to convey a variety of moral messages that are relevant to everyday life. Through the symbolism of Shiva transformed into a barren hill, as well as characters seeking meaning in life, perseverance, cleanliness, karma, spiritual awareness, sincerity in worship, and courage, the poem offers many valuable lessons that readers can learn. Literature studies show that literature, including poetry, has a significant impact on the formation of character and morality of readers (Nussbaum, 1997; Rosenblatt, 1978). Poetry also has the ability to touch emotions and evoke deep reflection, which makes it a powerful tool in moral education (Vendler, 2004).

Although much research has been done on the role of literature in education, there are still shortcomings in research that specifically explores how poetry can be used as a tool to teach educational values. Most research tends to focus on prose and novels, while poetry as an educational medium is often overlooked. In addition, although there are several studies that address the representation of nature and morality in literature, very few have explored how these elements can be applied in formal education curricula to enrich the learning process of students. According to Glazner (2005), the lack of attention to poetry in education can be caused by the perception that poetry is more difficult to understand than other forms of literature. This research aims to fill this gap by emphasizing the importance of poetry in value education. Furthermore, this research will show how poetry can facilitate the effective teaching of moral and ethical values (Gadamer, 1989).

This research aims to explore and analyze the educational values contained in the poem "Bukit Semut" by Seno Joko Suyono. By conducting a critical analysis of these poems, this research will identify various moral and ethical values that can be taught through literature. In addition, this study also aims to show how poetry can be used as an effective teaching tool in formal education, as well as provide recommendations for the integration of poetry in the educational curriculum. This analysis will cover the various aspects of symbolism, narrative, and themes raised in poetry. The ultimate goal is to develop a pedagogical approach that utilizes poetry as a tool to teach students the values of life (Coles, 1990; Piaget, 1965). The results of this research are expected to enrich the literature on literary education and provide a basis for practical implementation in the educational environment.

This research is important because it offers new insights into the role of poetry in the education of moral and ethical values. By exploring how the poem "Bukit Semut" can teach various educational values, this research can make a significant contribution in the field of literary education. The results of this research are expected to encourage educators to use poetry as an effective teaching tool, as well as help students develop a deeper understanding of various aspects of life and morality. In addition, this study also aims to fill the gap in the literature by providing empirical evidence on the impact of poetry in education, which can be the basis for further research and curriculum development. Method

This research is an effort to explore Seno Joko Suyono's poems about educational values. For this reason, this study uses a qualitative method with a content analysis approach (Pamungkas, 2021; Pattaro, 2016). The main source of data for this research is Seno Joko Suyono's poetry texts published on the

Borobudur Writers and Cultural Festival page. This collection of poems was chosen because it is considered to represent the best works of Seno Joko Suyono's that represent the message of education. In the reading process, data collection is carried out by collecting poetry texts. The selected texts are then identified and selected to ensure their suitability with the research objectives. The data analysis technique used is content analysis, which consists of several steps. First, it identifies the educational values that emerge in each poem, such as self-awareness, inner peace, appreciation for nature, acceptance, forgiveness, love, and spiritual search. Once these themes are identified, each poem is coded based on a relative category, to help in organizing the data and simplifying the analysis process (Strauss & Corbin, 1998).

To ensure the validity of the data, triangulation of data sources and analysis methods is carried out. Data sources were triangulated by comparing findings from various poems and looking at the consistency of emerging themes. Meanwhile, triangulation methods are carried out using various analysis techniques to ensure accurate and in-depth interpretation of the data (Hussein, 2009). After that, data was interpreted by reading the text in depth and understanding the context and symbolism used by Seno Joko Suyono's (Ratna, 2005; Wibowo et al., 2023). This process aims to uncover the meaning of each emerging theme and how these themes convey educational values. After that, the conclusion is determined based on the educational values contained in the poems.

Results and Discussion

Based on the analysis carried out, Seno Joko Suyono's poems represent educational values. These poems implicitly or explicitly convey various moral and ethical messages that are relevant in the context of education. Some of the educational values that can be identified from these poems are shown in table 1.

In addition, the results of research from Steger, Kashdan, and Oishi (2008) published in the *Journal of Positive Psychology* show that the search for meaning in life correlates with higher psychological well-being. Through the search for the meaning of life described in poetry, readers are invited to reflect on the purpose and meaning of their own existence.

Perseverance and Patience

In addition, Curtis, Cairncross, and Yonli (2000) in *the International Journal of Environmental Health Research* also found that effective hygiene education can reduce the incidence of hygiene-related diseases. improve an individual's emotional and spiritual well-being. Through this evocative narrative, poetry teaches the importance of sincerity and dedication in carrying out worship. Sincerity in worship helps individuals develop a deeper relationship with God and increase their religious commitment.

Courage and Determination

Men who continue to try despite being threatened and rejected many times show courage and determination. Courage is an essential element in life that helps individuals overcome challenges and achieve their goals. Determination shows that success is the result of dedication and courage in the face of obstacles. Further research is needed to measure the effectiveness of poetry as an educational tool in a broader context. Empirical studies involving experiments and surveys can provide deeper insights into how poetry affects students' understanding and attitudes toward educational values. In addition, the integration of poetry and literature in the formal education curriculum can be considered to enrich the learning process and develop students' character.
